# POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS

A possessive pronoun is a pronoun that is used to indicate possession or ownership.

- This pen is **my pen**, not **your pen**.
- This pen is **mine**, not **yours**.



**MINE**

- This is my laptop. It's **mine**.

**YOURS**

- These glasses are mine, not **yours**.

**HIS**

- This is my brother 's book. It's **his**.

**HERS**

- He offered to swap his camera for **hers**.

**OURS**

- I'll show you to your room. **Ours** is next door.

**YOURS**

- The house is **yours**.

**THEIRS**

- The ship is **theirs**.

# REFLEXIVE PRONOUNS

We use a reflexive pronoun as a **direct object** when the **object** is the **same** as the **subject** of the verb.

Subject pronouns	Reflexive pronouns
I	myself
you	yourself
he	himself
she	herself
It	itself
we	ourselves
you	Yourself, yourselves
they	themselves

Ex- 1. He hurt **herself** while playing.

2. I introduced **myself** to the manager.

# Relative Pronouns

Peter is the one  
**WHO**  
gifted me a scarf.

It is made up  
of a fabric **THAT**  
is very soft.



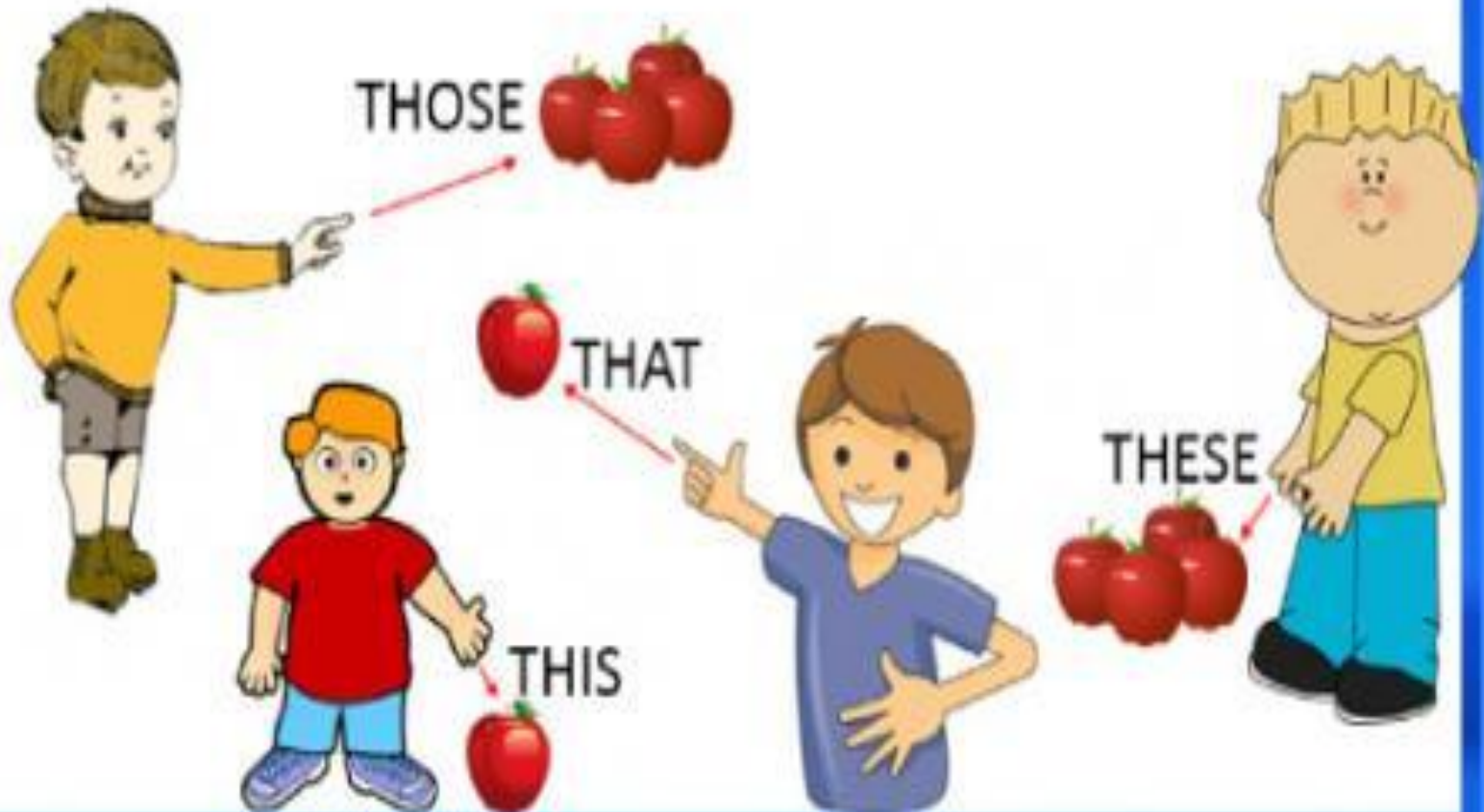
A relative pronoun is used to connect a clause or phrase to a noun or pronoun. You see them used everyday with the most common relative pronouns being: who, whom, which, whoever, whomever, whichever, and that.

## Relative Pronouns

WHO	Relates to people (subject)
WHOM	Relates to people (whom)
WHICH	Relates to animals and objects
THAT	Relates to people, animals and things
WHOSE	Refers to possession
WHERE	Refers to places
WHEN	Refers to time
WHY	Refers to reason
WHAT	Relates to things

Demonstrative pronouns **points out**  
**the nouns to which they refer.**

Interrogative pronouns assist in forming questions. There are five interrogative pronouns. Each one is used to ask a specific question or indirect question:

**what which who whom whose**



**WHAT** is your name?



**WHOM** does Jim live with?



**WHICH** is your favourite sport?



**WHOSE** book is that?



**WHO** is your favourite singer?
